Last year, Gray teachers were involved in the District pilot of a new document, Communicating Student Learning. We are referring to this document as CSL. The requested feedback from District parents and teachers following the pilot project and has made a decision to implement a revised version of CSL. This document will replace our old report card. It will look very similar to the one you received last year; however, we hope that the changes will improve the clarity of information that parents receive about their child's progress.

This year, the District gave schools permission to remove the reporting of grades on the final CSL document that goes home in June 2018, should they choose to do so. After consultation and deliberation, Gray has made the
