#### Our School Goal

Every school in BC is required to have a plan for student achievement called, Framework for Enhancing Student Learning. In Delta, each school has developed their framework based on the Spiral of Inquiry, a way in which we approach the work that we do. This Framework provides a focus for all the teaching and learning that happens in schools. It is a living document that continually shifts in order to meet the needs of our student body. Therefore, every Framework has a goal toward which the school is working. At Gray, "Our goal is for all students to self-regulate and think critically as they take ownership of their learning and contribute to their community." We would like all of our students and parents to be aware of this goal. So, to help make that a reality, we have had posters made for each classroom and around the hallways. They should be arriving soon. Please make sure to look for them when you come into the school.

#### Summer Student Dress Code

Last week we experienced some lovely summer weather, and sure hope that more is on the way. However, summer weather brings with it skimpier summer clothing. Therefore, it is once again time for a reminder about student attire. Please remember that we ask

all students, Kindergarten to Grade Seven, boys and girls, to wear tops that cover their shoulders and stomach, shorts that reach to the thigh, and shoes that are suitable for active days on the field and playground, and in gym classes. Children cannot do the many activities required of them when they are wearing shoes that do not stay on their feet securely, such as flip flops and loose crocs. 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### Track and Field

Our intermediate students have been very busy practicing for the Regional Meet next Tuesday, May  $8^{th}$ , 9:30 a.m.-2:30 p.m. Teams have now been determined and permission forms sent home to those who have qualified. Students will assemble at *Gray* and walk over to the track at North Delta Secondary.

If your child is participating in the Track Meet, please ensure that your child arrives to school at 8:15 a.m. promptly and suitably attired, as we will be unable to wait for latecomers. Please remember that this is a regular school day for all students, so those not participating in the track meet are expected to attend class as usual.

Participants should bring a packed lunch and snack, including a water bottle, and dress for the weather. You may remember that last year was an absolute deluge, so lets hope for sun this year! The cafeteria at North Delta will be open, and the North Zone A organizing school, Brooke, will have a concession open. Students may bring some money, should parents choose, but please remember that the school cannot be responsible for any losses that may occur.

## Primary Track Meet

Division 1 students have planned a Track Meet for the Primary classes on Monday, May 14 and Tuesday, May 15 from 1 pm to 3 pm.

Primary classes will be taking part in modified track activities on the all weather field. Come out and cheer on your son or daughter while they take part in the activities.

Parents are welcome to attend the meet to cheer our team on. <u>Please remember</u>, if you will be taking your child home with you from North Delta Secondary, you must check them out with one of the supervising teachers on the hill. Any students not returning to Gray at the end of the meet <u>MUST</u> give a permission letter from their parent to the supervising teacher on the hill before they may go home with another family.

Students who place in their events and qualify for the District Track Meet will be notified by the end of the week and a permission notice will be sent home. At the District Track Meet, if students qualify for the Provincial Track Meet their Parents will be responsible for entering their child and making arrangements for attending the Provincial meet on their own.

These three simple steps can help Canadians prepare for all types of emergencies. In Delta, our schools run earthquake drills complete with evacuation and in some cases, full exercises including post-earthquake site management and student release.

Schools throughout Delta will be conducting earthquake drills on various days through EP Week.
