We have learned that positive encouragement goes a long way. It's going to be a great year and each of the students were very thoughtfully placed in their new class for the year – it will be fun for them to grow and learn with a new group of classmates. It often takes time for students to adapt to a new learning environment. We appreciate your support during this time of transition and encourage you to reach out to your child's classroom teacher if they need some extra help getting used to new routines.

Context: The number of staff members and divisions assigned to Gray Elementary is decided by the Delta School District and is based on projected student enrolment. Enrolment numbers, class size and composition guidelines affect the configuration of classes.

Combined classes are an organizational necessity based on student numbers. Research also indicates that multi-age groupings (combined classes) provide very positive learning environments for children. Studies show that children in multi-age classes learn to become more independent, responsible learners and develop a greater degree of social responsibility. Achievement levels of these students are as good as, or better than, the achievement levels of students placed in single grade classrooms.

Assigning students to classes is a very complex task that takes into consideration a variety of factors including learning styles and strengths, what a student can achieve in relation to the goals of the curriculum, degree of independence in work habits, social and personal needs, age and physical maturity, previous placements, diverse learning needs of the students, as well as parental insight. Our objective is to create balanced classes, taking all the above into consideration. For this school year, classes have been assigned as follows:
